

WHY AFRICA?

- Poverty rates, living on less than \$1.90 per day, approach/exceed 40% in Tanzania and Kenya
- WHO African Region estimates that
 - over 400 million people have some form of oral disease
 - 26.3 million people have vision impairment
- Oral disease can lead to cardiovascular disease, diabetes, cancer, pregnancy complications, etc.
- Vision impairment leads to low academic and work performance, low self-esteem, limited opportunities, etc.

DENTAL SERVICES




- Sealants/fluoride as appropriate

- Glasses for over 36,000 people
- Clinics at almost 400 schools, testing and educating every person
- Steady employment for team members
- Leading edge, high quality equipment (auto refractors, phoropters, slit lamps, test lenses, etc.)



MEET AGNESS & GADIEL




- 13 years old

- Vision correction 1200


- 6 years old

INTERESTING FACT – THE NEED FOR READERS SPIKES AROUND AGES 40 - 80





A NEW APPROACH TO OUTREACH

- Collaborative effort with MCT and local dental schools
- International mission trips versus local change agents
- Community Health Fellowship model:
 - 3 year program with 1 cohort per year
 - 30 recent Dental Therapy Graduates
 - 6-month Fellowship
 - Field placement throughout Tanzania
 - In person and field training to be oral health ambassadors
- Cohort 2022 starts October 24

COMMUNITY HEALTH FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

Curriculum includes:

- Communication skills for Community Health Leaders
- Re-defining leadership
- Establishing an entrepreneurial mindset
- Time management
- Basics of nutrition, WASH, vision and other NCDs

Goals (over 3 years)

- 90,000 community members reached across TZ
- 75% of fellows continue community-level work
- Complete integration with SKYGEN programs and team members
- Expansion into Vision and into Kenya



NSK HOSPITAL VISION AND DENTAL CLINICS

Partnership with local hospital – Started 9/8/22

Referral location for complex issues identified at mobile clinics

General services include:

- Auto-refraction
- Pressure checks
- Dental cleaning
- Minor restorative work

Dentists and ophthalmologists available:

- Major dental work
- Cataracts & other eye issues

Patients charged base on ability to pay



KALILUNI MEDICAL CENTER

Village in remote mountain area

One small clinic; Machakos hospital is 20 miles away

Samuel Muinde built the center

Gave us the building to use for at least 4 year

Will have both dental and optical departments

Completion goal is end of November



MAJI YA CHAI

Farmers and a few small businesses

No nearby access to care

Start with Optometry clinic

Expand to Dental

Greatly impacted by fluorosis

Lens cutting operation
